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COMPREHENSIVE POULTRY POLICY, NEED OF THE HOUR

There are several court orders clearly stating that poultry is an agricultural activity, but some State Governments think differently. As a first step, the Government of India should issue a Government Order stating that poultry is part of agriculture. The State Governments then can tweak the policy according to the situation in that particular State, after taking suggestions from the poultry sector.

Large scale expansions are happening in the southern States, except in Karnataka. If there is clarity on the agriculture status, the sector will be able to attract substantial investments. Also it will help the poultry farmers in getting incentives and benefits that the agriculture sector is availing.

Ease of doing business

Poultry farmers face a lot of harassment by village panchayat officials and villagers citing pseudo issues. An appropriate directive by the Government to protect poultry farms and farmers is highly recommended. The State Governments should pursue on priority with the Centre to get all clearances and incentives.

The Government should allot land for poultry waste processing (rendering) in all districts

private enterprise. Setting up of state-of-theart rendering plants will not only solve the menace of solid waste management, but also help the government to ensure cleanliness. An efficient and seamless supply chain is a must.

Attractive Power Tariff

Most of the agricultural activities are getting attractive power tariff, but in Karnataka, poultry farmers are paying higher power rates on par with industries. Poultry feed mills and hatchery operations require adequate power supply and attractive tariff for growth.

Promote Chicken & Egg to boost immunity

The Government should promote Chicken & Egg to boost immunity in the interest of public health by releasing periodic ads, hoardings and other promotional media. It should also distribute eggs free of cost at midday meals in all schools such that students get proper nourishment and make them healthy and competitive.

PROF. (DR.) R.N.SRINIVAS GOWDA



Prof. R.N.Srinivas Gowda stands tall among the veterinarian and academic communities. Having held many distinguished posts, Dr. Gowda's contribution to the scientific and academic community is immense.

He is the former and founder Vice Chancellor of Karnataka Veterinary, Animal and Fisheries Sciences University; former Director of the Institute of Animal Health and Veterinary Biologicals; Head, Department of Veterinary Pathology, University of Agricultural Sciences; among other posts.


His contribution is limitless some of which include developing a disease resistant poultry for rural poultry production, He was responsible for total eradication of Avian Leukosis Complex through genetic selection tracing back the affected parents and culling them.

He has also worked on early diagnosis of Avian Leukosis complex in chicken through cytological variations. He was the first person to diagnose "Hydropericardium Syndrome "causing devastating mortality in the country and in the world. He developed and popularised the "leechi disease" vaccine. He also was the first to diagnose the Equine Infectious Anaemia in Horses and reemergence of IBR in cattle in India.

He has been Chairman or a member of several committees. He was member for drafting11th Five year plan in animal Husbandry sector to Government of India.

He is a recipient of several awards including the prestigious CLFMA award.



The Institute of Veterinarians of Poultry Industry (IVPI), in association with USSEC conducted their technical programme on October 22 with the theme 'Harnessing the business potential of Tier 2 & 3 cities for chicken and eggs'.

Prof. G. Devegowda, President, IVPI, in his inaugural speech mentioned that even though India is one of the top five growing major economies in the world, it continues to remain in the serious category of global hunger index. With the population of over 65% under the age of 35 years, India forms one of the youngest nations in the world. He insisted to continue IVPIs efforts through this program to promote chicken and eggs as the readily available and economic protein source among Indian population, particularly in Tier 2 & 3 cities, to overcome malnutrition. Post covid, there is increased consumption of chicken and eggs to boost the immunity and for its health benefits.

Mr. Nishanth Chandran, Founder and CEO of Tender Cuts, said that the poultry sector had to overcome the perception of consumers who thought that chicken cut in front of them is fresh, but they overlook the hygiene factor. There needs to be concerted awareness and education of consumers on how chilled and frozen chicken cut in hygienic and modern conditions is the way to go and grow.




Dr. Veena Shatugna, former Deputy Director, National Institute of Nutrition, Hyderabad, said poultry products had high protein content and was nutritious, but the governments promoted rice and other cereals based on economic consideration, resulting in not so healthy and fit children. She cited many instances of stunted growth and also said research had shown that children who consumed poultry meat were taller and stronger, while carbohydrates gave just energy. She stressed the need for nutritional security that India needs to immediately address.
